## **Dear Parents and Carers**

We continue to monitor the latest advice and guidance on the Coronavirus (Covid-19). I should stress that currently there is no immediate cause for concern and, subject to the points below, your child is safe to continue to attend school. However, where your child or someone in the home has, within the last 14 days, returned from any of the destinations listed in Category 1, Category 1a or Category 2, it is important that you take action as described in the information below:




## Travelling abroad over the coming weeks:
