Big Idea: Fairies

Next week's Big Idea and Big Challenge

Next week we will be building on the children's interest in the tooth fairy and focus on teeth. Looking after our teeth is an important part of our curriculum and we will be talking to the children about brushing their teeth twice a day, eating healthy foods, visiting the dentist and of course the tooth fairy! We will be giving the children their very own toothbrush and practising brushing our teeth, as well as designing and making toothbrushes, counting teeth, sorting food that is good or not so good for our teeth, role-playing a visit to the dentist, reading information books about looking after our teeth and we might even build a giant's mouth outside!

The Big Challenge: Ask your child to either say or draw/write instructions about how they brush their teeth. You could even make a short video to share with us on Tapestry. How many teeth do you have? Can you look in the mirror and count your teeth? Do all your teeth look the same? Maybe you could look at the teeth of different aged people in your family and see if you can spot any similarities or differences! Have fun exploring and learning!
