| English In English, we have begun the year with our whole school focus text: 'Peace on Earth' by Smiriti Hills. Using this text we have written our own poems. Our next text, 'House Held up by Trees' by Ted Kooser, introduces us to persuasive writing as we write an advertisement for selling a house! Following on from this, we write letters for our text 'A Journey Home'. In our final text of the Autumn term, we make cross-curricular links with Geography and Science with We are water protectors'. | PSHE In PSHE Our focus will be 'building relationships', focusing on a range of activities that will help enable children to develop new friendships and think about new situations and welcoming children to our school. |
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| Maths This term In maths, we will be focusing on number and place value looking at the composition of two-digit numbers, partitioning into tens and ones through the use of practical resources such as place value charts, deines and part-whole models. We then focus on addition and subtraction. | Religion and World Views Through learning about religious celebrations, we will begin to understand how Christians celebrate Harvest and why Christmas is a special celebration for Christians. |
| Science This term children we will be covering the unit 'All about Habitats'. We will learn about the life processes of living things and discuss the difference between living, dead and never alive. We will then categorise different organism types, linking them back to their natural habitats. Within this unit, we will also learn about food chains. | PE In PE we will cover a Dance unit where we will focus on sequencing movements and in Gymnastics we will learn about different points of contact, using various parts of our bodies. Our games units cover basic ball skills and agility. |

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| History In history our topic is 'Movers and Shakers' where we discuss 'Who is a significant person?' and what makes them significant. We will focus on activists and look at the local historical activist, Oliver Cromwell. We are excited to go to Oliver Cromwell's house in Ely. | Computing This term we will teach children how to be a safe researcher by looking at ways to stay safe online and using technology responsibly. |
| Art We have already begun our artwork, linking to our whole-school text, Peace on Earth, to colour-mix various colours linking to emotion. After this, we move onto exploring the world through mono-print. | French The children will be learning about the country of France itself. They will be having fun learning how to greet people in French and introduce themselves. Counting in French, learning our age and birthday will also be a focus. |
| Music This term we will be focusing on recognising high and low pitched notes and moving to music in different ways following a steady beat. We will then use a range of musical instruments to keep the beat. After listening to various music types we will discuss how the music makes us feel and give our opinion about if we enjoy it or not. | Geography In Geography we will learn about the Wider World, beginning with a focus on the UK and which nations make up the United Kingdom. We will learn about each nation and what makes them unique. |
